

REFUND POLICY

Program Registration:

For persons wishing to cancel their registration for any activity sponsored by our department, a full refund will be issued if staff is given at least 72 hours prior to the start of the activity. If notice is given greater than 24 hours and less than 72 hours prior to the start of the activity, a 50% cancellation fee will be withheld and the remaining amount will be refunded or credited to the user account. Notices given less than 24 hours prior to the start of the activity, or a participant's failure to show, will not be eligible for a refund. Extenuating circumstances will be reviewed and handled on a case-by-case basis.

Facility Reservations:

For persons wishing to cancel their facility reservation will need to notify the Salina Parks and Recreation office at least 2 weeks prior to the reservation to receive a full refund of the rental fee. If cancelled within 2 weeks of the event, a 50% cancellation fee will be withheld and the remaining amount of the fee will be refunded or credited to the user account. No refund will be offered due to failure to notify Salina Parks and Recreation or non-use of facility. Extenuating circumstances will be reviewed and handled on a case-by-case basis.

Trips and Tours

For trips with a registration deadline, cancellations will be accepted and a full refund will be issued prior to the registration deadline. Cancellations that occur after the registration deadline will require a replacement person in order to receive a full refund. Openings will be filled from an established waiting list.

If no replacement participant is available, persons who wish to cancel their registration after the deadline will only be eligible for a pro-rated credit to the user account. The credit amount will be equal to the actual, per person fees recovered by staff including any non-refundable deposits or ticket purchases.

For those trips with no registration deadline, cancellations will be addressed in the same way as described above. However, all refund requests will be handled on a case-by-case basis, with the amount to be determined by the timing of the request and the refund policy of each specific trip destination. Extenuating circumstances will be reviewed and handled on a case-by-case basis.



Youth 7 v 7 Soccer

7 v 7 Spring soccer league: Divisions are as follows, 1st/2nd, 3rd/4th, 5th/6th, & 7th/8th. All divisions will be separate girls and boys if participant numbers allow. There will be 6 games plus a year end tournament. The cost is \$65/player fee and team shirts are included. Games will be played on weekends, mostly Saturday mornings, but occasionally a Sunday afternoon and some Monday nights under the lights at the complex. Teams are put together based on the school the player attends - a play with your friends concept!

Youth Soccer - Team

Registration is now open for teams already established in the Spring 2025 Parks and Recreation Youth Soccer League. Please note that teams are responsible for their own uniforms or shirts, as these are not provided by Parks and Recreation. Additionally, each team must have an adult manager or coach who will be accountable for the team. All communication will go through this individual, who is also responsible for keeping the team informed. Team placement will be based on the age of the oldest player. The Salina Parks and Recreation league divisions are organized by school grade, as follows:

- PreK/Kind. (Coed)
- 1st/2nd Grade (Boys & Girls)
- 3rd/4th Grade (Boys & Girls)
- 5th/6th Grade (Boys & Girls)
- 7th/8th Grade (Boys & Girls)

For example, if a team has one 5th grader and the rest are 4th graders, the team will play in the 5th/6th division. Similarly, if a team has one 7th grader and the rest are 6th graders they will play in the middle school division (7th/8th).

Practice scheduling will occur at the end of the coaches' organizational meetings in the order of team registration. Coaches are encouraged to come prepared with their preferred weeknight, time, and field. A chart of availability will also be provided at the time of reservation. Coaches Certification: Every head coach must have approved certification. Meeting: Monday, March 24th, 6:30 p.m at the Salina Fieldhouse. Age is as of May 1, 2025. \$675 team fees due at registration (maximum 16 players). All head coaches, assistant coaches, & dugout assistants must complete a background check prior to coaching. 

Foster Parents:

Foster homes feed, care, train, socialize and most importantly love shelter animals. The need for more foster families is ever present as every day more animals are being released to the shelter.

Foster parents take in sick or injured dogs and cats needing quiet space and extra attention as well as expectant and nursing moms with their puppies and kittens.

The TLC given in foster care, in addition to the extra space foster families provide, allow for fewer animals to be euthanized.

Serving Saline County

The Salina Animal Shelter is now providing services to the Saline County outside the City of Salina. If you find a stray dog or domesticated cat in the county you can drop it at the shelter so that it can receive the care it deserves. The Salina Animal Shelter will also accept owner surrenders from Saline County residents for adoption.

Dog Park

The City of Salina has two public dog parks; Barkley Park, and the Salina Animal Shelter Dog Park. Barkley Park is a fully fenced, 2-acre public dog park located South of Dean Evans Stadium on Markley Rd, and is open to the public daily from 5am to 12am. A second, smaller dog park is located at 329 N 2nd directly behind the Salina Animal Shelter to the west. This park is also open from 5am to 12am with the exception of a daily closure from 9am to 11am Monday through Friday. Your dog must be over 4 months of age and have a current rabies shot and city license (Salina residents only) to visit either park. Remember also keep your dog on a leash until you are inside the park.

Adopting? Look past appearances!

A common mistake made by adoptive families is choosing a pet based on appearance and not compatibility. We recommend describing the individual qualities you are seeking, and then researching which breeds will fit your lifestyle. You may be surprised at what you find, or "who" you find. Salina Trails

Located throughout the city, Salina Trails is a system of 24 miles of dedicated trails for pedestrians and bikers. Some of these trails are existing, some are planned and some are proposed for the future. Currently there are 13 miles of completed or planned trails and 11 miles of proposed trails. The trails can be divided into four different types: levee trails, multi-use, the Smoky Hill River Trail and Park nature/walking trails. Plus one mountain bike trail.

The Parks & Recreation Department has two neighborhood centers and two buildings in the parks available for use for civic organizations, family reunions, club meetings, and receptions. Reservations may be made one week before or up to one year in advance. Rental Fee is due at time of reservation. Gazebos & Stage

The Parks & Recreation Department has two gazebos available for your use at no charge: One small gazebo in the Oakdale Park Formal Gardens and one small gazebo in Sunset Park. The large gazebo in Jerry Ivey Park can be reserved for a minimal charge. The Eric Stein Stage at Oakdale Park can also be reserved. Potential users of the Eric Stein Stage and the Jerry Ivey Gazebo are required to fill out a facility request form to reserve these facilities. Park Restrooms

Seasonal restroom facilities are available at community parks and larger neighborhood parks. Restrooms are open early April until late October. Year-round heated restrooms are available in Oakdale Park, Jerry Ivey Park, Bill Burke Park, and Berkley Family Recreation Area.

Spray Grounds

There are water playgrounds at two different park sites. Located in Centennial and Hawthorne Parks, the spray grounds have both in-ground and above-ground interactive features, built-in seating, and shade structures. These facilities will be open daily throughout warm weather months of May thru September, weather permitting.
